Electronic StakeOut® (ESO) Highlights

Highlight of pattern crimes solved with the help of 3SI's GPS Tracking Technology

PACKAGE THEFTS

The **Anaheim Police Department (CA)** took the initiative to implement a bait packages program using ESO. A thief, riding his bicycle, grabbed the bait package and took off while still on his bike. The device alerted the department and within 5 minutes, the thief was apprehended and arrested.



Two criminals were caught by the **Portland Police Department (OR)** using ESO-equipped bait packages. Placed around the neighborhood, these packages were utilized to entice thieves. An alert was sent after one of these packages was stolen and Portland PD was notified immediately. Two criminals were charged with felony mail theft.

AUTO BURGLARY

The **Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office (FL)** used 3SI's ESO unit to track auto burglaries in a particularly high crime area. An ESO unit detected a crime and tracking began readily on 3SI's secure tracking website. After following the suspects for several miles, the detectives apprehended the criminals while they were committing a second auto burglary. The suspects were charged with multiple burglaries.

LAWN MAINTENANCE EQUIPMENT THEFT

In **Redlands, California**, lawn maintenance equipment was being stolen from vehicles in a local home improvement store parking lot. To combat this crime wave, police deployed a truck with a weed trimmer baited with an ESO device in the parking lot. After each arrest, the trimmer was re-deployed and over two months, police arrested 11 suspects.

BICYCLE THEFTS

The **University of Redlands (CA)** experienced a multitude of bicycle thefts. Officers baited a bike on campus with ESO. The bike was stolen and tracked to the nearby football field where it was abandoned along with a second stolen bike. Officers came upon a suspect on yet another stolen bike, who also had a traceable forensic liquid on his hands. Once linked to the thefts, officers were able to locate a fourth abandoned bicycle along with a backpack containing bolt cutters (and more traces of the forensic liquid). The suspect was arrested for petty theft.



In an effort to put a stop to bicycle thefts in the area, the **Boulder Police Department (CO)** installed ESO on a bait bike. An alert was soon received showing the baited bicycle was on the move. Police determined the bicycle was inside a green Ford Explorer and they attempted a traffic stop, but the vehicle eluded officers. After tracking the vehicle through multiple jurisdictions, the driver abandoned the vehicle and fled on foot but police successfully apprehended him. The suspect was a known auto and bike thief. A second bike, tools, suitcases, and other possible stolen items, were found in the vehicle.



Experiencing a spike in bicycle thefts on campus, a university in **College Station, Texas** began utilizing ESO devices. The police department deployed one of the devices in a bait bike on the university's campus. In under two hours, alerts were received and two criminals were arrested.

GAS STATION ROBBERY & MURDER

In late 2014 and into 2015, Joshua Golson-Orelus committed a series of robberies at gunpoint, with increasing violence at each event. In January of 2015, he shot and killed gas station attendant Hany Awad for not complying quickly with his demands during a robbery.

Nassau County Police Department (NY) implemented the use of ESO, deploying the devices in various gas stations in the area. In June of 2015, Golson-Orelus robbed his last gas station when he stole cash and the ESO device. Police were quickly able to track him and make an arrest. Golson-Orelus was later sentenced to 55 years to life in state prison for his various crimes.

TRACTOR TRAILER THEFT

The town of **Hiram, Georgia**, deployed 3SI's Slap-N-Track (SNT) Tracker after many trailer thefts. SNT was installed on a baited commercial trailer to capture thieves. Shortly after installation, the department was notified that the baited trailer had been stolen. It was tracked to a residential address where the stolen bait trailer, along with a stolen USPS trailer, were hidden in a mass of trees. Two arrests were immediately made.

The PD re-baited the trailer and took it to a different location where it was able to lead officers to another thief.
